Criminology

Criminology is the study of crime from a social perspective, including examining who commits crimes, why they commit them, their impact, and how to prevent them.

What is covered?

- Changing awareness of crime (internal)
- Criminological Theories (external)
- Crime scene to courtroom (internal)
- Crime and punishment (external)

What does the course involve?

You will cover a range of topics over the two-year period as outlined above. In addition to the subject content, criminology will help you to develop analytical and critical ways of thinking. You will develop your extended writing skills as well as verbal communication skills. These skills are beneficial across a range of subjects.
