A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL MICHAEL FITZSIMONS

It was a brilliant day and Kevin's speech to students and staff was truly inspirational. One of our takeaway messages from Kevin was regarding his personal mantra which was along the lines of, 'to become a true champion, you have to be a champion at home first.' I thought this was a wonderful statement and it encapsulates one of our professional standards brilliantly, integrity. Kevin was trying to impress upon students the need to get the basics right, to focus on relationships (especially with yourself), to be a nice person as often as possible and most importantly, to respond well when things become difficult. ASPIRATIONS

This term many of our Year 13 students have begun to get offers back from universities or invitations to interview, which is incredibly exciting! We also have many students seeking apprenticeships. We hosted a very popular talk from West Yorkshire Police about degree apprenticeships in policing and roles within the force. We are pleased to be working with the DWP to deliver a world of work programme to some of our Year 13 students, to develop students' knowledge of the labour market and hone their CV writing and interview skills.

It was also National Careers Week this term and we hope this has really got students thinking about where their level 3 studies could take them. Activities have included a Sociology subject taster day at the University of Leeds, biomedical and forensic science talks from the University of Manchester, an interactive media workshop and even a visit from the National Space Academy to look at the role of scientists in satellite engineering and space exploration!

As a joint celebration for National Careers Week and World Book Day, we also enjoyed a Trinity Talk from the founder of a local publishing house in Hebden Bridge, Bluemoose Books, about his career journey and the different roles in the publishing industry.

TRINITY SCHOLARS

Amber and the other Year 13 Scholars continue to work hard to achieve the grades required for the rich variety of Higher Education opportunities they hope to pursue after leaving TSFA.

Several students are actively pursuing the University of Cambridge's HEE programme, whilst a number of others have successfully been placed on other programmes including with the Sutton Trust, Reach for Excellence and others. STUDENT WELLBEING

This term students have been taking part in Mindfulness sessions in the run up to their trial exams. EXAMS/ASSESMENTS

Our Year 13 students have now completed their final set of trial exams, their conduct throughout these are exemplary. To ensure students are fully prepared for their official results day on Thursday 15 August, we are running our first ever 'Trial Exam Results Day' on Friday 12 April. This event will take place at 11.30am, students will be presented with their trial exam results and both teachers and pastoral support staff will be on hand to celebrate the efforts that students have put in so far and to also provide support and clarification of results, in terms of UCAS and employment.

Both students and teachers are working incredibly hard, and several additional sessions are running before and after college, as well as during the holidays and the occasional Saturday. We highly value the support of parents in encouraging students to attend these additional sessions. The official exam series starts on Monday 13 May 2024, however a small number of practical and BTEC examinations will take place from 29 April 2024. Students will shortly be receiving their timetable for the summer examinations and parents will be able to view these on the MCAS app. We appreciate that all the support that you are giving to your child throughout this time and strongly recommend that students fully utilise the 6 Steps to Revision.

TSFA Trips

Y12 CHEMISTRY STUDENTS VISIT TO MANCHESTER UNIVERSITY:

Year 12 Chemistry students spent a day visiting The University of Manchester, one of the world's top universities. In the morning our students carried out some exciting practical work and learned about handling radioactive materials safely as well as some of the issues linked to geological disposal of radioactive waste. The trip was sponsored by The University's Dalton Nuclear Institute and Trinity Sixth Form was chosen as the only college to participate in this very special event.

The afternoon was spent learning about the applying to university and what to put in a good personal statement. Our students participated in a Q&A session with undergraduates and found out more about what student life is like. On a tour of the campus, we found dinosaur fossils and the lab where Rutherford did his famous gold foil experiment that revealed the structure of the atom.











SKI TRIP

A group of 32 Year 12 and 13 students travelled to Cerler Ski Resort in the Pyrenees, Spain and enjoyed a week on the slopes from 9 to 16 March 2024. The week consisted of 25 hours of skiing (and ski school lessons) learning the basics such as snow ploughing to the more advanced skills of parallel turning. Our students progressed throughout the week moving from green runs to blue runs and some to even red runs. Students took part in a range of evening activities, including Pizza night, quiz night, Churros night and an Escape Room, as well as time to explore the local area. A fantastic time was had by all and the staff were amazed by how students skiing skills developed throughout the week.

Ours students were an absolute credit to us throughout the whole week and we can't wait until next year's trip.















WORLD CHALLENGE

This half term we launched our World Challenge trip to Morocco to our Year 12 students. Our current Year 12 students have the opportunity to go to Morocco in summer 2025 after their A Level exams. Students will be departing on the 2nd July and they will be away for 13 nights and the trip is split into 3 themes:

- 1 Cultural appreciation students will get to appreciate the culture in Morocco and will get time to explore the markets in Marrakesh and taste the wonderful Moroccan cuisine as well as learn basic craft skills and have some down time in the beach towns.
- 2 Community initiative we will journey into the Atlas mountain to live with and support a local community. Students will get the opportunity to spend time and build bonds with families within in these communities.
- 3 Expedition The final part of the trip is an expedition up in the Atlas mountain. Students will trek into the highest parts of the Atlas mountains and will experience wild camping as well as eating and sleeping under the stars. Will zero light pollution, experiencing night sky be a moment to remember.
