Salary:

Salaries average at around £30,000 per year

Qualifications:

You'll need paid or unpaid experience of working in the community or voluntary sector, gained from:

- volunteering in a local community group or charity
- working in a related career like housing, regeneration, social work, youth work or teaching
 You could do a course in community development at college or university, but this isn't essential. If you're in the
 UK, you could get into this job through an advanced level apprenticeship.

Job Description:

You'll work with individuals, families, and groups in socially or financially deprived areas. You'll provide leadership, and bring local people together to make changes and tackle social inequality. You'll also help people to develop their skills, knowledge, and experience.
