Salary:

Between £45,000 and £48,000 per annum

Qualifications:

You'll need to join the <u>Institute and Faculty of Actuaries (IFoA)</u> as a student member. You'll then study for professional exams while you work as a trainee actuary. To join the IFoA you'll usually need a degree in maths or a related subject, like: actuarial science, economics ,physics, engineering, accounting or statistics.

Job Description:

Actuaries provide their clients with an analysis of the costs and risks of certain financial policies. You could work in areas such as insurance, pensions or consultancy.
